Our school council members have been voted for by their fellow pupils for the academic year. The members will attend meetings and vote on issues in school and developments to improve life in school for our pupils. You will see our council members around school wearing the purple jumpers.

YOUNG CARERS

At Crossacres Primary Academy we are dedicated to making sure all our pupils reach their full potential. However we are aware some of our pupils take on caring duties at home form a very young age for other family members above and beyond what may be expected for a child of their age. The child, up to the age of 18 may be a 'Young Carer' if they regularly look after a family member who has an illness, disability, mental illness or addiction. This person may be a sibling, a parent or a member of their extended family. The types of caring tasks undertaken by a young carer can vary but may involve some of the following:

- Practical tasks (cooking, housework and shopping)
- Managing the family budget, collecting benefits and prescriptions
- Managing and administering medication
- Looking after or 'parenting' a sibling with medical needs
- Helping someone communicate whether that is due to a hearing impairment or because English is not the family's first language
- Providing emotional support for other family members

Pupils benefit from knowing there is someone to talk to when they need to and that school understand the additional responsibilities they take on. If you think your child is a 'Young carer' and they would benefit from support, please do let us know by telephoning the school office on 437 1272 and asking for Mr Campbell who is the operational member of staff with responsibility for our 'Young Carers', or email him at <u>campbell.j@crossacres.manchester.sch.uk</u>. We will do our very best to put support in place to meet each childs differing needs. Also, if eligible, support can be provided to the child through a Young Carers organisation.
